PROSTATE ARTERY EMBOLIZATION :

Prostate artery embolization (PAE) is a treatment for patients who suffer from an enlarged prostate known as benign prostatic hyperplasia (BPH). BPH affects millions of aging males but can be treated by reaching out to the doctors at South Florida Vascular Associates.

STEP 01

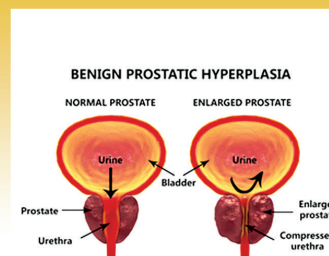
A small needle puncture is made in the patient's upper thigh which gives the doctor access to the artery supplying blood to the prostate.

STEP 02

Small beads are injected into the arteries supplying the prostate, which reduces the blood flow and shrinks the prostate.

OUTCOME

The reduction of prostate size results in less compression on the urethra and improvement of symptoms.



SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF BPH MAY INCLUDE:

- Difficulty starting a urinary stream
- Dribbling at the end of urination
- Having to urinate frequently at night
- Increased urinary frequency or urgency
- Inability to completely empty the bladder
- Inability to urinate
- Urinary tract infections (UTIs)
- Urine that is pink in color due to the presence of blood
- Urinary stream that is weak, or stops and starts

DID YOU KNOW?

- In the U.S., a surprisingly high number of men have an enlarged prostate or benign prostatic hyperplasia (BPH)
- 50% of men over age 50
- 70% of men age 60-69
- 80% of men age 70+

ADVANTAGES OF PAE:

PAE offers a quick, effective return to normal urinary function. Compared to the other surgical treatment modalities, PAE provides many benefits:

- No incisions
- No hospital stay—performed in office
- 1 week recovery at home
- No bladder catheter needed (for most patients)
- No sexual side effects. No retrograde ejaculation
- No risk of incontinence
- Minimal pain and swelling
- Can be performed on moderate or large size prostate gland with no upper size limit
- Less than 1% complication rate
